

What is Spiritual Direction?

Spiritual direction is "help given by one Christian to another which enables that person to pay attention to God's personal communication to him or her, to respond to this personally communicating God, to grow in intimacy with this God, and to live out the consequences of the relationship." (William A. Barry and William J. Connolly, *The Practice of Spiritual Direction*)

Spiritual direction focuses on religious experience. It is concerned with a person's actual experience of a relationship with God.

Spiritual direction is about a relationship. The religious experience is not isolated, nor does it consist of extraordinary events. It is what happens in an ongoing relationship between the person and God. Most often this is a relationship that is experienced in prayer.

Spiritual direction is a relationship that is going somewhere. God is leading the person to deeper faith and more generous service. The spiritual director asks not just "what is happening?" but "what is moving forward?"

The real spiritual director is God. God touches the human heart directly. The human spiritual director does not "direct" in the sense of giving advice and solving problems. Rather, the director helps a person respond to God's invitation to a deeper relationship. Learn more by contacting:

Dear Saint Katharine Drexel Parishioners:

As another fiscal year has ended, we are filled with gratitude for all that we have accomplished together, and I want to take a moment to share the financial health of our parish with you. Your continued generosity and commitment to the vision-mission of SKD parish have made this year a true blessing. With the assistance of the Parish Finance Council, this report serves to inform you of our financial standing, the projects we've completed, and the upcoming work still ahead.

The Finance Council reviews the parish finances quarterly and we have filed these reports with the Diocese of Venice, on time, as required. It is especially important to note the following: Church income (revenue) for the fiscal year to-taled \$1,463,816.00 which was an increase of \$55,543.00 compared to last year. Expenses for the fiscal year totaled \$1,649,611.00, an increase of \$23,102.00. We experienced higher expenses due to an increase in parish insurance, personnel, utilities, maintenance of our buildings, and ministry and liturgical supplies. Please review the financial charts posted on the parish website and in the parish bulletin.

SKD parish relies on every family, both year-around and seasonal, for your generous contributions to support not only SKD parish but also the Catholic Faith Appeal. For those families who have already contributed to the Catholic Faith Appeal, I thank you. Your generosity is very much appreciated.

As a parish, we have not yet met the assessment goal of \$241,000.00 for the Catholic Faith Appeal. To date, the parish has collected only \$233,494.00 and pledges to date of \$254,895.00. We are close, but we are short of the goal by \$7,505.00. **Did you know:** of the 4,692 registered families only 395 families contributed to the Catholic Faith Appeal. For those who have not yet contributed, please consider making a sacrificial gift. Let the words of Saint Paul speak to you as they speak to me, *"Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver"* (2 Corinthians 9:7). All gifts are appreciated.





We experienced higher expenses in FY 23-24 due to increased personnel expenses (\$44K [salaries, retirement, Pay Roll taxes, Extra Clergy]), the rectory expenses were lower, but self-insurance costs increased \$42K, Ministry down (\$21K [youth down, music down, religious education up]), general up (\$52K DoV Collections up \$2K, CFA assessment up \$23K, office [new computers, licenses, IT services 14K]), and depreciation up \$30K. Though we reported as a loss, depreciation is not a cash expenditure so our cash position is strong.

In our second reading from Hebrews, we see that when Jesus allowed himself to be crucified he was actually being a priest, offering himself for the sins of the world. After giving his life for us, he takes his place as God's equal. He is now the eternal Priest, so all clergy since the time of Jesus are visible signs of that priesthood. When we celebrate the Eucharist, Jesus' sacrifice is there. We are present at his death and resurrection, without needing a flux capacitor or a time warp. His sacrifice is an eternal one, redeeming all past and future sins. So if you have come back to church after being absent for years, God has already offered you for-giveness. The Eucharist also reminds us that Jesus is present in glory, with us always, sharing his priesthood with all the baptized. We can show God's mercy by forgiving each other. Since Jesus lives in us, we offer our lives as sacrifice for sins. Does that mean we are supposed to seek ways to suffer? No, it means the suffering we cannot avoid can become our offering to God, a way to take up our cross as Jesus did, and a way to experience God's power in our weakness.

At the Eucharist, we pray with the priest, "that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God..." All the sacrifices we make, from accepting serious illness, to giving up something for Lent, are ways we take part in the priesthood of Christ. *Tom Schmidt*

Music in the Mass Presentation of the Gifts... Immediately folwe move into the Liturgy of the Eucharist which begins with the Presentation of the Gifts.

Saint Augustine was impressed by a fifth-century procession of gifts in Rome in which the faithful brought from their own homes things from their kitchen tables. Augustine called this an "admirable exchange" for their gifts God gave back Jesus. The prayer over the gifts from the sixth day in the octave of Christmas uses Augustine's language: "Lord, receive our gifts in this wonderful exchange: from all You have given us we bring You these gifts, and in return, You give us yourself.."

Here we are in November, the month we, as Americans celebrate Thanksgiving. Many of us will be joining family and friends for dinner on this civic holiday. For the host, it's a **LOT** of prep work. After buying my first home (2002) I somehow got "elected" to have the family Thanksgiving dinner at my house. Which meant cleaning the house **(before AND after cause I'm a clean freak)**, setting up the dining table, preparing all the main foods and getting ready for guests. Then of course when everyone leaves it's KP/Clean-up duty. Exhausting! Since moving to Florida, the past four years I have evaded being the host **(although I miss it)** and even though dinner isn't at my house I always make sure to bring something to share be it food or spirits when invited to someone else's home. **"Giving** and **"Thanks"** just seem to go hand in hand... even St. Francis' Prayer ends a verse with *"in giving of ourselves we receive..."*

Every Mass the simple offering of BREAD and WINE is shared for the Holy Mass. The word Eucharist literally means THANKSGIVING! This act of offering gifts begins the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Procession of the Gifts is accompanied by the Offertory Chant. This may be a chant or hymn sung by the assembly. It is also permissible that the CHOIR may offer a choral selection. If the choir is to offer a hymn or choral piece it *generally* is reflective in nature as to help the assembled delve deeper into the Eucharistic celebration and scripture of that Mass. Many times if I choose a "choral anthem" it is meant to even augment and highlight the words of the Gospel proclaimed by the Priest at that particular Mass. The music is to continue at least until the gifts are placed on the Altar. I generally will continue the music until the Priest has finished washing his hands and is prepared to continue with Prayer over the offerings going into the Eucharistic Prayer.

As a music director I will also listen to words of the **Homily** given by the priest and even if a hymn is already been planned I *sometimes* will literally change that song so as to re-emphasize and augment a strong message or theme from the words of the Homily.

As we near Thanksgiving Day let us be thankful for all the **"gifts"** in our lives especially the gift of Jesus Christ, in the Holy Eucharistic Feast we are invited to each Sunday.

These Canons State:

A Godparent/Sponsor must be a Catholic who has been Confirmed. He or She must be in their 16th year or more and he/she must know the fundamental truths of the Catholic Faith, to be a practicing Catholic who goes to Mass on Sunday & Holy Days, receives the sacraments according to the minimum requirements (the Easter Duty is a minimum requirement), and sees to the religious instruction of his/her own family.


Prayer for Safety In Hurricane Season
